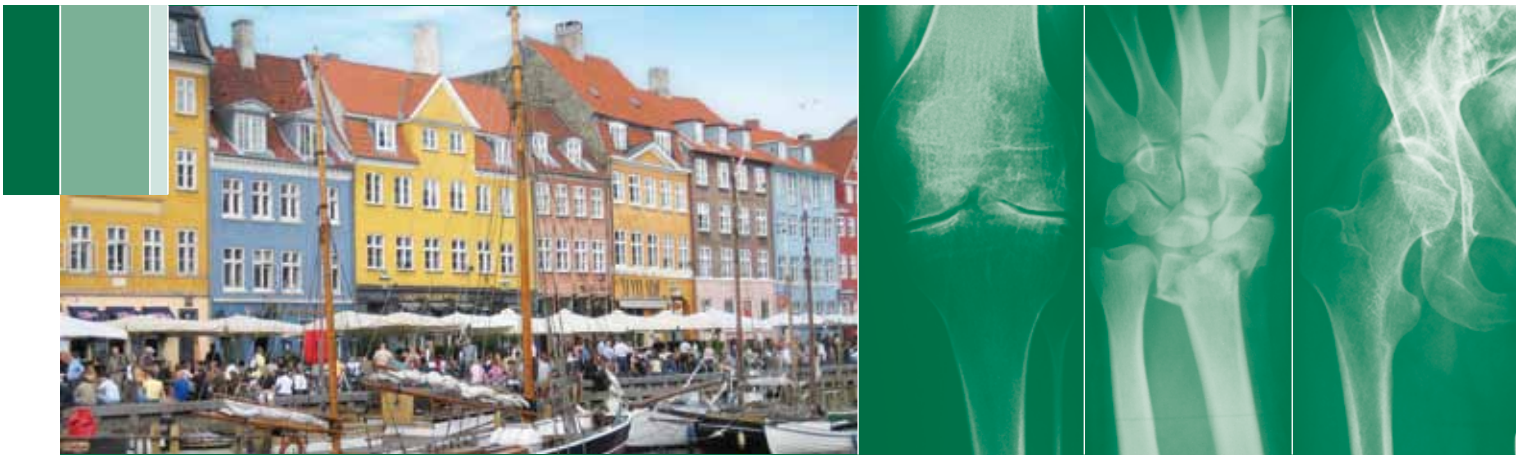

ONLINE SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

After logging on to the EFORT portal, be sure to follow the onscreen instructions precisely as they lead you through the submission process. There is no restriction on the number of abstracts you may submit, and you can proceed using the same login and password for all your abstracts.

Some information is mandatory, however, and you will not be able to proceed further if you do not complete the fields. Please also note that you may modify your abstract(s) until the submission deadline date. Consider your submission category carefully. If there is a discrepancy between your topic and its category, EFORT reserves the right to change the category or reject your abstract. **EFORT accepts a maximum of two oral presentations and five e-posters per registered participant. INFORMATION ON ABSTRACT ACCEPTANCE

You will be notified by e-mail about the acceptance of your abstract(s) by 2 January 2011 at the latest. The presenting author of a selected abstract must undertake to attend the Congress and present the abstract in the session and at the time designated by the Scientific Committee. **EFORT therefore requires all authors to register by 30 January 2011 at the latest.**

Technical support will be provided for authors of abstracts, as detailed in the frequently asked questions and help document.

ORAL PRESENTATIONS (Free Paper Sessions)

Computer projection only will be available for presentations in the meeting rooms. The best-rated free papers may be put forward for the *EFORT Free Paper Award*. From the presentations that are received, the three best will be selected for the award. The authors of the selected papers will be informed prior to the Congress, and the certificates will be presented during the official opening ceremony.

E-POSTER PRESENTATIONS

The poster presentations will be in electronic format. A large display area with e-posters will be dedicated to poster presentations.

Out of the best-rated e-poster abstracts submitted for the Congress, the ten best will be awarded the *Jacques Duparc Award*. Authors will be informed prior to the Congress, and the certificates will be presented during the official opening ceremony.

Historically, Copenhagen owes its existence to its position on the narrow Øresund strait separating Denmark from Sweden and commanding the entrance to the Baltic – one of the great trading routes of medieval Europe.

The magnificent new Øresund Bridge, which links the city with Malmö and southern Sweden, was opened in 2000.

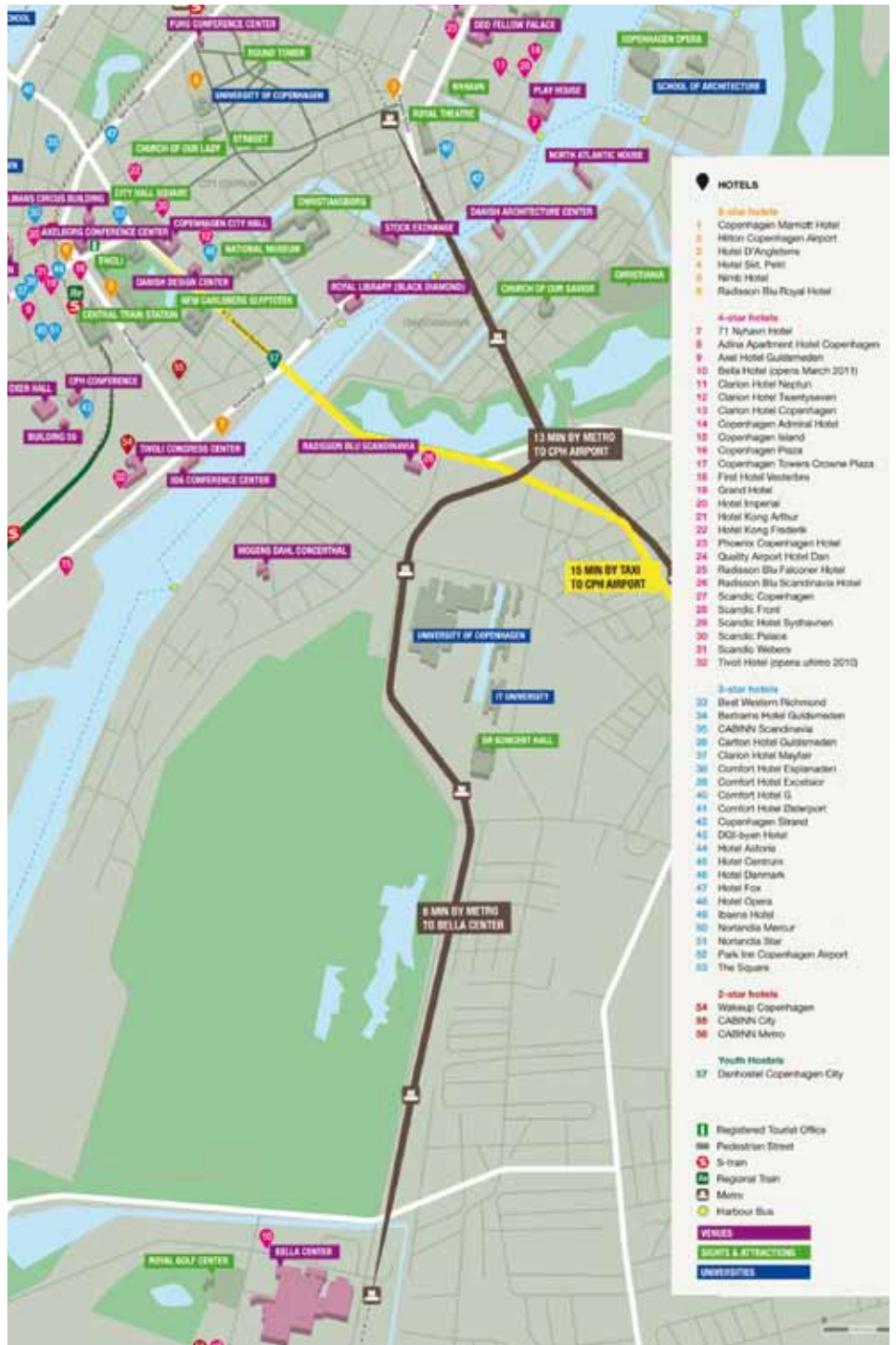

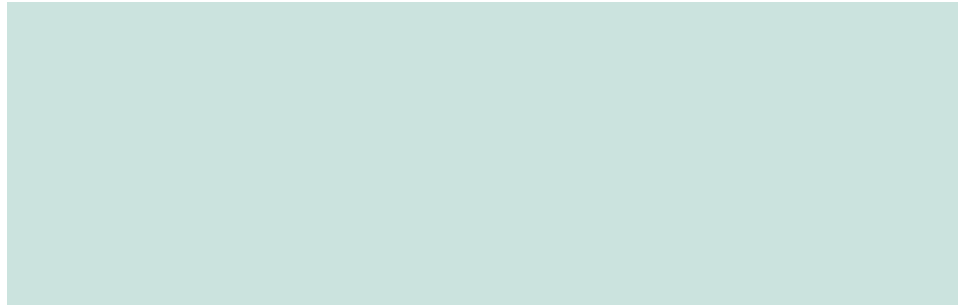

BY ROAD

Bella Center is located at Center Boulevard 5, 2300 Copenhagen S. Follow the airport motorway, E20. The exit for Center Boulevard is number 19 (to Ørestad and Bella Center). Parking fees apply at the Bella Center, and payment can be made in cash (DKK and EUR) or by credit card.



BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Bus: Information on bus schedules can be found on the transport company Movia's website (www.moviatrafik.dk)

Bus line 30 Runs between Vesterport station (via the central station) and Bella Center.

Bus line 4A Runs from Svanemøllen station to Sundbyvester Plads via Valby and Sjælør.

Metro: The Metro line M1 runs between Vanløse and Vestamager (West Amager). The Bella Center metro station is located next to Bella Center's eastern entrance. More information and schedule available at www.m.dk.

Taxi: A taxi from Bella Center to the city centre costs about DKK 200.

A taxi from Bella Center to Copenhagen Airport costs about DKK 150-200.

Bella Center is just a 10-15-minute drive by taxi from Copenhagen central station. From Copenhagen central station you can also get to Bella Center in 20-25 minutes by taking bus line 30. All regional trains also stop at Ørestad station, from which you can transfer to the Metro.

Note that intercity trains do not currently stop at Ørestad station Copenhagen Airport to Bella Centre. The Bella Center is a 10-minute taxi drive from Copenhagen Airport (DKK 150-200).

VIKINGS IN ROSKILDE

LOUISIANA TOUR

The Louisiana Museum of Modern Art is located in northern Sjælland, with a panoramic view across Øresund. The museum frames the sculpture park facing the sea, and the interaction between art, nature and the museum architecture is quite unique.

Louisiana is an international museum with a considerable collection of modern art. The museum's permanent collection includes more than 3.000 works and is one of the largest in Scandinavia. Its particular focus is post-war art, and it includes artists such as Picasso, Giacometti, Dubuffet, Yves Klein, Andy Warhol, Rauschenberg, Henry Moore, Louise Bourgeois, Philip Guston, Morris Louis, Jorn, Baselitz, Polke, Kiefer, and Per Kirkeby.

NORTH SJÆLLAND CASTLE TOUR

This tour will give you a chance to admire North Sjælland, the preferred setting of Danish kings and queens for centuries. The tour takes you along the beautiful Danish Riviera, with beaches, summer cottages and marinas, to the city of Elsinore and a visit to Kronborg Castle – also known as Hamlet's Castle from the setting for Shakespeare's famous play. The castle was built in 1420 on the shores of Øresund to control the narrow strip of water that separates Denmark from Sweden. You will enjoy the views from the castle ramparts, as well as tour the chapel, courtyard and the medieval banqueting hall.

Lunch will be served before you drive through beautiful countryside to Fredensborg Castle – the summer residence of the Royal Family. Here you will have a short photo stop before you continue to the city of Hilleroed, where you visit Frederiksborg Castle, which was built in the 17th century and has now been turned into a national historical museum. This pearl of history, built in the magnificent Dutch Renaissance style with a touch of baroque, houses treasures of art, tapestry, porcelain, silver, furniture, etc.

You return to Copenhagen in the late afternoon.

LOUISIANA AND KAREN BLIXEN MUSEUM
